BUSH FIRE UPDATE SUNDAY NOVEMBER 29, 2009

Situation

NSW Rural Fire Service and National Parks fire crews have **contained** the Pinnacle Swamp Fire (burning between Lake Windamere and the western edges of Kandos and Rylstone) which has burned approximately 5500 hectares.

Crews continue to monitor the fire, mopping up hot spots.

The Cudgegong Road is open however motorists are advised to exercise caution due to the movements of fire service vehicles and heavy plant.

THERE ARE NO ROAD CLOSURES DUE TO BUSH FIRE IN THE MUDGEE AREA.

Wollemi National Park

A number of fires continue to burn within remote and rugged terrain in the Wollemi National Park. Remote Area Fire Fighting Crews continue to work on containing the fires with the assistance of aircraft and heavy plant. ***Wollemi National Park remains closed other than the following camping/day areas; Dunns Swamp and Newnes.*** There is a Total Fire Ban for Wollemi National Park and for additional National Parks visitor information please visit www.npws.nsw.gov.au

The weather for Sunday: Dry with maximum temperature of 30, humidity 25% and winds from the North West gusting to 50kph. The morning dust clouds are expected to clear early to mid afternoon.
